to-coast trip with Disney.

At the time, Bill Hay, a renowned radio announcer ("Amos & Andy"), was president of the International Bowling Board, the USA's first IBB president. Charles Middleton, a Northwest U.S. bowler, established the \$100,000 Middleton Fund, which provided the impetus for American lawn bowling's Memorial Foundation.

The group saw the Southwest Division's Bob Russell and Don Buckley win the U.S. Pairs title.

The U.S. Championship Pairs event was inaugurated in 1958 at the Inn at Buck Hill Falls, a Pennsylvania resort community. To this day, the Pairs victor's permanent trophy is the Buck Hill Falls Championship Cup.

DEAR DR. GOODWICK.....



RX for more consistent excellence

Dear Doctor Goodwick,

As it happens, things are a bit tough in the doctoring business, so our Dr. Goodwick has had to moonlight not one, but two jobs. In the a.m., he tends to the business of the Southwest Division, as its president. In the p.m., he's the top banana 'zebra', generally referred to as National Umpire in Chief. Dr. Goodwick, aka Chief ump Conrad Melton, posted the following Ump Stumper":

It is the 8th end of a triples match. Team A is up 3 as Skip B readies to roll his final bowl. He drives and causes a moderate explosion of the head. The vices scurry around with their eyes on the ground for a few seconds, then both signal Team B earned 3 points.

Meanwhile, Skip A, at the mat end of the rink has gone up on the bank and is looking down the sideline. "It's out!" he yells. "The jack is out! Come and look", he says to Skip B. Skip B looks and can see that the jack is near the sideline, but a clear picture is impossible because a bowl is also on the line between the jack and the ditch and obscuring the rink marker at ground level.

By now, the two vices had signaled and were done with their responsibilities, so Vice B reaches down and picks up the jack.

Skip A walks to the head complaining that the jack was out of bounds. A bystander who was watching the game on the adjacent rink says: "The jack was out."

Skip B, an Umpire, is faced with the two vices who agreed that the jack was in vs. his opposing skip and a bystander who both said it was out vs. his own view that in or out could not be determined.

Feelings were strong on all sides, except from the bystander who remained calm after stating his "observation."

If you were Skip B, what would you do?

UMP STUMPER Answer
This event actually happened:
 Skip B (an umpire) thought that a ruling would not be any easier to determine by another Umpire; and he was determined to avoid the appearance that he was showing partiality to his own team. So he decided the best thing to do was to replay the end. Skip A agreed. In the replay, Team A got three points.
 What should have happened: An emotionally involved ump should have been called in. With a clear conscience, that ump surely would have ruled that the vices, who have sole responsibility to count points at the conclusion of an end, should have been the determinants of the point count. The opinions of a protesting skip and the bystander should have both been discounted.
